At the time of execution of the awarded contract, the contractor will be required to execute another affidavit in substantially the same form. In addition, during the performance of the contract, such contracting business entity or employer shall continue to participate in the E-Verify program and shall verify every employee that is required to be verified according to the applicable federal rules and regulations. HAZARDOUS WASTE DISPOSAL SERVICES

Alabama A&M University solicits submissions of written proposals, on a competitive basis, from qualified respondents to provide for Alabama A&M University services described in accordance with the terms and conditions detailed within.

Alabama A&M University is seeking an experienced and qualified company(s) to package, manifest, label, transport, and dispose of hazardous, non-regulated and universal waste generated by the University. Wastes are generated from teaching, research and maintenance operations. The University currently is a large quantity generator (LQG) site. The minimum of 5 waste pick-ups per year will be made and shall not occur more than ninety (90) days apart.

A sample waste profile in included in Attachment A. The types shown are historical data only. They are not an indication of future waste or new streams of waste not listed in Attachment A. The contract shall cover the actual needs of Alabama A&M University throughout the term of the contract whether they are more or less than the types indicated.

The University reserves the right to award this contract to multiple vendors.

A. PERFORMANCE TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Service Provider and his employees shall maintain all certifications / licenses ae required by Local, State and Federal regulations to perform the task required. All contract workers on site shall show proof of certifications / licenses and the appropriate training.

Service Provider shall perform all services in accordance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and orders, including, but not limited to: the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA), and regulations, rules and orders of the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the U. S. Department of Transportation (DOT), Alabama Department of Environmental Management (ADEM), Occupational Health and Safety authority, the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT), and any local regulations relating to the wastes managed under this contract.

A Waste Profile Report is included as Attachment A. The quantities shown represent historical data for the most recent alternate years of available data. The contract shall cover the actual needs of the University throughout the term of the contract whether they are more or less than the quantities shown.

The Service Provider shall employ only competent and satisfactory personnel and shall provide a sufficient number of employees to perform the required services efficiently and in a manner satisfactory to the University. If the Contract Administrator or designee, notifies the Service Provider in writing that any person employed on this contract is incompetent, disorderly, or otherwise unsatisfactory, such person shall not again be

employed in the execution of this contract without the prior written consent of the Contract Administrator.

The University reserves the right to inspect any and all transportation, storage, treatment, or disposal facilities unannounced during regular business hours.

The Service Provider shall continuously maintain adequate protection of all work covered by the contract from damage or loss and shall protect the property from injury or loss arising in connection with the contract, and shall make good any such damage, injury or loss. The Service Provider shall adequately protect adjacent property as provided by law and the contract documents.

B. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

The Service provider shall be responsible for adhering to the general requirements below, but are not limited to:

- A. University business hours are 7:00 a.m., to 4:00 p.m. unless otherwise indicated by an authorized University's representative.
- B. The service provider shall maintain a single point of contact on a 24 hour/holiday/weekend basis.
- C. All employees for the service provider shall wear identification in the form of name tag and clothing with the company name patch.
- D. All areas of work shall be left in a clean condition and all debris shall be removed daily and upon completion of service.
- E. Service provider vehicles shall be clearly marked with service provider name.
- F. Salvage equipment if requested shall be returned to the Owner.
- G. If a job can't be completed during regular business hours, the service provider will be allowed to finish the next day, or complete the job on overtime with the approval of an authorized University's representative.
- H. Overtime rates shall not exceed 11/2 times the normal rate or what is allowed by federal guidelines.
- I. Safety is the sole responsibility of the service provider.
- J. Submit written reports with invoices to document hours of work.

Invoicing

- A. When services are requested, compensation to the Service Provider for service call response will be based rates from the price proposal form.
- B. Travel time to and from the location will not be compensated.
- C. The service provider shall be required to keep legible and detailed documentation on all work performed under this contract. All invoices shall be received within seven (7) calendar days after work is performed. Invoicing shall include all the following in the order below:
 - a. AAMU Purchase Order Number

- b. Name of District Representative that placed service call
- c. Date of Service
- d. Provide Name, transporter's license numbers and addresses
- e. USEPA Identification Number for Hazardous Waste
- f. Statement of compliance with Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations
- g. Copy of DOT Hazardous Waste License
- h. List of any available in-transit storage areas, secondary transporters, or sub-Service Providers that may be used in the transport of waste to the primary disposal facility
- i. Itemized list of all items removed from site
- j. Name of technician
- k. Signature of AAMU Representative
- 1. Total Cost

Duration of the Agreement

The term of the Agreement shall commence on the date that the Agreement is executed by all parties thereto. Thereafter, unless earlier terminated, the term of the Agreement shall continue for an initial term of three (3) years. The Agreement shall reserve for AAMU the unilateral option of extending the term of the Agreement for two (2) additional terms of one (1) year(s) each, provided that the maximum duration of the Agreement shall not exceed five (5) years. The Agreement shall also contain a provision granting to AAMU the right to terminate the Agreement, with or without cause, upon thirty (30) days' notice. (Hereinafter, the period from the time of commencement of the term of the Agreement until the time of expiration of the term of the Agreement shall be referred to as the "Agreement Term").

If at any time the University is dissatisfied with the services performed under this contract, the University may request and receive new technician(s).

The Service Provider shall not subcontract any part of the agreement with another Service Provider.

C. SCOPE OF SERVICES

Management of Waste Pick-Ups

- Provide all necessary packing materials, containers, forms and labels
- In lab packs, ensure all waste are compatible with each other (mixing corrosive and flammables and oxidizers)
- Picking up waste at scheduled time. If delay occurs, provide notification of approximate time so University can coordinate with labs on change of schedule
- Provide correct placarding for transportation vehicles for compliance with Department of Transportation (DOT)

Documentation

- Provide accurate and timely submittal of documentation (manifests, bills of lading, certificates of recycling, tracking reports and invoices)
- Manifests are legible and correct labeling of waste for accurate recordkeeping for the University
- Time the copy of the manifests from final disposal site returned to the University to ensure Alabama A&M University is in compliance with federal, state and local regulatory agencies.
- Provide inventories of the amount waste shipped from the university in a year for regulatory reporting requirements (Alabama Department of Environmental Management (ADEM) 8700-12 Notification of Regulated Waste Activity and 8700-13 United States Environmental Protection Agency (USPEA) RCRA SUBTITLE C SITE IDENTIFICATION FORM)
- Provide online access for the University to the Service Providers website to obtain copies of manifests, certificates of destruction, amounts of waste generated, etc.

Job Site Safety

• The Service Provider shall take reasonable precautions for the safety of, and shall provide reasonable protection to prevent damage, injury, or loss to Service Provider employees or other persons who may be affected nearby.

- The Service Provider shall exercise the utmost care and carry out activities in the execution of this contract under supervision of properly qualified personnel.
- The Service Provider shall comply with required applicable laws, statutes, ordinances, codes, rules and regulations, and lawful orders of public authorities bearing on safety of persons and property or their protection from damage, injury or loss.
- The Service Provider shall adhere to the Occupational Safety and Health Administration's (OSHA) most recently published safety and health regulations for general Occupational Safety and Health (29 CFR 1910) for the duration of this contract.
- The Service Provider shall, before the first application for payment, submit the name(s) of the person(s) who shall have designated responsibility for job site safety under this contract and who shall be knowledgeable about the OSHA regulations.
