According to data received from AAMU Office of Institutional Planning, Research and Effectiveness, we enrolled 1,852 (27.9%) first generation students for Fall 2023. First generation is defined as neither parent/guardian completed a four-year degree. The participation and support from the campus community for the F1rst Bulldog Celebration was phenomenal.

We look forward to the continued support of the campus community as we strive to infuse diversity into the AAMU campus culture and establish a reputation of inclusive excellence, regionally, nationally, and globally. No unit or department can achieve this alone; fostering inclusion, belonging, and participation requires consistent and intentional efforts from all of us.


