Implementing Solutions During a Crisis

\$173,000 Donations to the COVID-19 Assistance Fund for food, rent, utilities, mortgage, transportation and prescriptions (as of 8/20/20)

\$58,600 (value) In-kind donations of masks, face shields, tote bags, water bottles, PPE safety signs and personal hygiene products

United Way staff have been locating "hard-to-find" PPE: sanitizing wipes, surgical and KN95 masks, sanitizer, gloves, thermometers, and face shields so our agencies can remain safe while delivering services to their clients.







Education is the Foundation

6,108 Students Pre-K to high school gained knowledge while participating in safe, structured enrichment programs outside of school.

89% met attendance, participation, and achievement goals in programs including STEM, homework help, physical fitness, career exploration, executive skills development, social and emotional skills and more.

65% named to A-B honor role by the end of the school year

Financial Stability

77,648 individuals & families were provided emergency & transitional resources during a time of personal financial crisis.

63,866 food packs and/or meals were distributed.

12,293 other emergency services including assistance with prescription costs were provided.



Promoting Health

27,281 individuals participated in programs to improve mental health and ADHD management.

12,743 children and adults found a path to recovery when facing a traumatic event.

6,935 adults and children raised their awareness about prevention of abuse and neglect in order to reach their potential.

ALABAMA KIDNEY FOUNDATION



Patient Assistance Program | Meets basic daily living needs and helps with transportation to and from critical services.

55 covers a month of transportation to treatments for a dialysis patient.

ALABAMA NON-VIOLENT OFFENDERS ORGANIZATION (ANVOO)



Brighter Futures | Provides wrap-around services to integrate formerly incarcerated persons into society as productive citizens, with short and long term solutions that eliminate barriers.

\$66 helps a client obtain a state ID, a gateway to returning to work and accessing resources.

AMERICAN RED CROSS OF NORTH ALABAMA



Service to the Armed Forces | Educates and provides services to active duty military personnel as they plan for, cope with, and resolve personal crisis situations.

\$68 provides emergency support services to a military family at a time of crisis.



Disaster Cycle Services | Stabilizes people in crisis after a disaster or house fire. Provides smoke alarm installations and home-safety checks in vulnerable neighborhoods.

\$15 provides ten comfort kits after the loss of a home.

THE ARC OF MADISON COUNTY



Stepping Stones to Independence | Creates and implements a vocational plan for individuals with disabilities. Focuses on continued education, career, and skill development.

\$247 provides one month of program enrollment.

BIG BROTHERS BIG SISTERS OF THE TN VALLEY



Defending Potential | Provides at-risk children with life changing, professionally supported 1:1 relationships with trained volunteers. Helps children build confidence and relationships, achieve educational success and avoid risky behaviors.

\$30 per week helps a child achieve success in life.

BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS OF NORTH ALABAMA



Academic Success | Provides career exploration and engages youth with tools to grow academically and personally during outof-school/after-school time through a nationally-proven model.

\$57 per month provides one child with full afterschool services every day.

THE CARE CENTER



Fuel Their Hunger to Learn | Matches student needs to services: food insecurity, individualized tutoring, mentoring, pre-graduation focus, afterschool clubs and summer camps with focus on STEM, health and fitness, as well as liberal arts for children ages K-12 in SE Madison County.

\$14 per month provides Bags of Blessings (weekend food support) for a child.



Ignite Your Potential | Provides individualized career planning and training with access to resources and support, with an overall goal of decreasing generational poverty in SE Madison County.

\$30 provides funding for one GED test.

CASA OF MADISON COUNTY (Care Assurance System for the Aging and Homebound)



Aging in Place | Allows elderly and homebound individuals to age in place and stay safe and independent in their homes through home safety checks, fall prevention, health education, wheelchair ramps, and transportation assistance to medical appointments.

17 per month provides CASA services to a senior or homebound individual.

CATHOLIC CENTER OF CONCERN



Emergency Financial Assistance | Fosters financial stability for families in danger of losing housing, critical medications, clothing, baby essentials, or utilities due to emergencies.

\$200 per month helps a family with a utility bill.

CHRISTMAS CHARITIES YEAR ROUND



Mobile Closet | Provides essentials to students through a mobile clothing closet delivered directly to their school.

\$25 provides clothes, school supplies and hygiene items to children.

COMMUNITY FREE DENTAL CLINIC



Critical Care Needs | Provides dental extraction for low-income uninsured adults with dental disease. Prevents expensive extensive hospital stays and missed work due to infected teeth.

\$215 provides simple dental extraction for one adult.

CRISIS SERVICES OF NORTH ALABAMA



The Domestic Violence Program | Provides emergency shelter (through Hope Place), advocacy, documentation of injuries, and counseling to people experiencing domestic violence.

71 per day provides a safety and support for a domestic violence victim.



Crisis Counseling Program | 24-hour crisis line with trained staff/volunters responding to people in crisis due to depression, trauma, life changes, loneliness, suicide, and other stressors.

\$7.50 provides support for an individual in crisis.



FAMILY SERVICES CENTER



Families & Schools Together (FAST) | Encourages family engagement with schools through parent trainings and activities to strengthen families and students' educational experiences.

\$10 provides one session of FAST for one family.



Living in Family Transition (LIFT HOUSING) | Provides quality, affordable, transitional and multi-site emergency shelter housing, with case management to help reach financial stability.

\$21 per day houses a low-income homeless family of four in a community-based single family unit.



Counseling | Provides affordable counseling with a Licensed Professional Counselor for people with mild to moderate mental healthissueswhomaynot qualify for services with other agencies.

\$30 provides a confidential therapy session.

GIRLS INC. OF HUNTSVILLE



Comprehensive Program | Inspires all girls to be strong, smart and bold. Comprehensive approach equips girls to navigate gender, economic, and social barriers so they grow up healthy, educated and independent.

\$60 sends a girl to an educational summer program.

HARRIS HOME FOR CHILDREN



BOOST After School Program | Provides mentoring, tutoring and counseling for at-risk foster children ages 12-20, so they develop socially, emotionally, and academically. Services and individualized education plans are coordinated with school staff.

\$25 purchases essential school supplies for a middle or high school student.

HEALS INC.



Bright Smiles | Provides accessible quality school-based dental care to children living in poverty to optimize their opportunities for success in school and the community.

\$20 per month provides a child with comprehensive dental care.



Healthy Kids/Healthy Eyes | Provides accessible quality school-based health and vision care to children living in poverty so they come to school healthy and ready to learn.

\$15 per month provides a child with comprehensive medical care.

HEART OF THE VALLEY YMCA



Early Childhood Education | Provides a safe, nurturing, developmentally-appropriate, high-quality early learning environment for children ages 6 weeks to 5 years.

\$27 per day provides full-time services under a framework of school readiness for a 3-year-old child.

IMPACT AMERICA



FocusFirst | Provides high-tech vision screenings for preschoolaged children and referrals for free or subsidized follow-up care.

\$13 provides vision screening and results and/or referrals for a child.

MANNA HOUSE



Personal Emergency Resources for Kids in Schools (PERKS) | Provides healthy, kid-friendly, ready-to-eat weekend backpacks of food each Friday for children who have inadequate amounts of food available to them while not in school.

\$5 feeds one child for one weekend.

NATIONAL CHILDREN'S ADVOCACY CENTER



Intervention & Clinical Services | Enables children to heal from the trauma of abuse and ensures community safety through a comprehensive team response to allegations of abuse.

\$250 pays for one medical exam for one child.



Stop Child Abuse and Neglect (SCAN) | Preventing child abuse by teaching children in a school environment how to recognize child abuse and how to respond to it.

\$125 provides a SCAN session for one classroom.



Healthy Families of North Alabama | An intensive home visitation program for over-burdened, first-time parents to increase childwell-being, postive parenting and school readiness.

\$125 provides a visit from a Family Support Worker to an at-risk family.

NEW HOPE CHILDREN'S CLINIC



Medical ADHD Program | Provides ADHD mental health care (evaluation, diagnosis & health management support) to children in a school-based, pediactric clinic environment.

\$50 provides evaluations and initial treatment of ADHD for a child.

CONNECTING THOSE WHO CAN HELP WITH PEOPLE IN NEED

Our mission is to identify the health and human service needs in Huntsville/Madison County and work with donors, volunteers, and partner agencies to develop, implement effective strategies & solutions.

(UW of Madison County's adminstrative cost is 22%. 37% is the national avg.)

PATHFINDER



Residential Rehabilitation Program | 12-step recovery program for men with substance abuse issues. A support system that provides food, shelter, transportation, counseling, treatment, crisis intervention, relapse prevention, and basic life skills.

\$150 provides a week of secure room and board, transportation and clinical support from licensed counselors for one person.

PHOENIX



Improves the quality of life, self-sufficiency, and employability primarily for individuals with disabilities. Services include vocational evaluations, job placement and coaching, educational services in high schools and job opportunities.

\$220 per month helps a person with a disability prepare for, obtain and keep employment.

THE SALVATION ARMY OF MADISON COUNTY



Extended Stay Sheltering | 3-4 month Case Management Program guiding those seriously seeking to change their situation from hopeless to hopeful. Customized goal setting, seeking/ maintaining employment and 1:1 sessions with a Case Worker.

\$125 provides a week of meals, housing, counseling, and resources for one person.

STILL SERVING VETERANS



Veteran Support Services | Counselors connect Veterans and their families to community partners to address immediate needs.

\$48 pays for one hour of counseling for a Veteran or a family member.

UNITED CEREBRAL PALSY OF HUNTSVILLE & TN VALLEY



Supports individuals with developmental, acquired and aging disabilities, and their families, through education, therapy, technology and social services to promote and enhance their independence, quality of life and community inclusion.

\$50 provides therapy to help a child walk, talk, eat, play, laugh, learn, and live life without limitations.

VILLAGE OF PROMISE



Children's Defense Fund Freedom School | Addresses summer learning loss and literacy of children living in vulnerable neighborhoods, from birth to post-secondary education.

\$166 per month provides a scholarship for an underresourced child.
