AL NON-VIOLENT OFFENDERS ORG. (ANVOO)



Brighter Futures | Provides services to qualified non-violent offenders to improve their quality of life and stability, and decrease the rate of recidivism.

\$136 helps a client obtain a state ID & access other vital resources to return to society.

Disaster Cycle Services | Meets basic emergency needs, financial assistance, and referrals to help local families who experience home fires or are affected by other natural disasters.

Stepping Stones to Independence | Provides those with disabilities extensive support and opportunities to be a contributing part of the community by maximizing volunteering, community activities, and/or employment experiences.

Keep Kids Connected | Inspires children to graduate high school with a plan (enrollment, enlistment or employment) and provides a mentor that will make a lifelong impact.

BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS OF NORTH AL



Academic Success | Provides career exploration and engages youth with tools to grow academically and personally during out-of-school/after-school time through a nationally-proven model.

\$71 per month provides one child with full afterschool services for a month. \$2.73 / 26 pay periods

THE CARE CENTER



Fuel Their Hunger to Learn | A needs-based supplemental education support program that provides enrichment and remediation to high-poverty students in rural southeastern Madison County.

\$60 provides students a full academically, develop age-appropriate experience for 1 mo. \$2.31 / 26 pay periods



Ignite Your Potential | A holistic, individualized approach to career and workforce development training for teens and young adults in rural SE Madison County.

\$200 a month builds job readiness skills and certification. \$7.69 / 26 pay periods

CATHOLIC CENTER OF CONCERN



Emergency Financial Assistance | Provides under-resourced individuals with basic needs of rent/mortgage, utilities and/or prescribed medication when in crisis in Madison County.

\$300 helps a family with a month's rent or utility bill when in crisis. \$11.08 / 26 pay periods

CHRISTMAS CHARITIES YEAR ROUND



Mobile Closet | An outreach program delivering clothing, hygiene items and school supplies directly to children in need at their schools.

\$15 provides clothes, school supplies, and hygiene products for a child. \$.58 / 26 pay periods

COMMUNITY FREE DENTAL CLINIC



Critical Needs Care | Provides urgent emergent care for those suffering with dental trauma, preventing extensive expensive hospital stays.

\$288 provides a dental extraction for one adult. \$11.08 / 26 pay periods

CRISIS SERVICES OF NORTH ALABAMA



HELPLine | Responds to crisis calls from individuals experiencing sexual assault, domestic violence, depression, anxiety, suicidal thoughts, and other personal crises.

\$4 provides support for an individual in crisis. \$.15 / 26 pay periods



Intimate Partner Violence Program| Provides safe shelter, crisis intervention, safety planning, lethality assessment, case management, court advocacy and other services for intimate partner violence victims.

\$71 provides a safety and support for a victim of domestic violence. \$2.73 / 26 pay periods

ENABLE MADISON COUNTY (formerly CASA)



Aging in Place | Enables the aging and homebound to live at home safely, independently, and with dignity.

\$22 per month provides services to a senior or homebound individual. \$.85 / 26 pay periods

FAMILY SERVICES CENTER



Counseling | Helps clients identify issues and develop healthy coping and communication strategies in an environment where they can openly discuss thoughts and feelings.

\$50 provides counseling therapy. \$1.92 / 26 pay periods

FAMILY SERVICES CENTER



Families & Schools Together (FAST) | A school-based prevention program designed to strengthen families and enhance the educational experience for students while reducing incidents of child abuse and neglect.

\$11 provides one FAST session for a family. \$.42 / 26 pay periods



Living in Family Transition (LIFT HOUSING) | A program for homeless families, with a strong emphasis on becoming self-sufficient through financial literacy, discipline, and accountability as pathways to independence.

\$638 houses a low-income family of 4 in a community-based single-family unit. \$24.54 / 26 pay periods

GIRLS INC. OF HUNTSVILLE



Comprehensive Program | Educates and empowers girls by providing research-based programming thus inspiring all girls to be strong, smart and bold.

\$33 provides 1 girl a safe, growing place for 1 month. \$1.27 / 26 pay periods

HARRIS HOME FOR CHILDREN



BOOST! Closing the academic achievement gap associated with being in foster care & improve academic & life outcomes.

\$33 provides a week of counseling and after-school tutoring for a foster "tween" or teen.

\$1.27 / 26 pay periods

HEALS, INC.



Bright Smiles | Provides underprivileged children age birth to 19 years with access to dental care to optimize their opportunities for success in school and in life.

\$20 provides a child with comprehensive dental care. \$.77 / 26 pay periods



Healthy Kids/Healthy Eyes | Gives underprivileged children age birth to 19 years access to primary and vision care to optimize their opportunities for success in school and in life.

\$30 provides a child with comprehensive medical care. \$1.15 / 26 pay periods

HEART OF THE VALLEY YMCA



Early Childhood Education Program | Provides a safe, affordable, high-quality, nurturing, and developmentally appropriate early learning environment, preparing children ages 6 weeks to 5 years to be ready for school.

\$30 per day provides full-time services under a framework of school readiness for a 3-year-old child. \$1.15 / 26 pay periods

IMPACT AMERICA



FocusFirst | Provides free vision screenings to preschoolaged children in daycares, Pre-Ks, and Head Starts, referring all children failing a screening for comprehensive follow-up care coordination.

\$3 provides high-tech vision screening, results & or referrals for a preschool aged child.

\$.12 / 26 pay periods

MANNA HOUSE



(P.E.R.K.S) Weekend Backpack Program | Provides kidfriendly, ready-to-eat, high calorie, foods in backpacks each Friday for elementary school children identified as currently experiencing food insecurity.

\$8.46 feeds one child for one weekend.

\$.33 / 26 pay periods

NAT. CHILDREN'S ADVOCACY CENTER



Child Abuse Response Program | Serves victims of child abuse and their families during the initial investigation and throughout the healing process.

\$600 pays for 1 medical exam for 1 child, necessary investigation & healing therapies. \$23.08/26 pay periods



Healthy Families | Provides home visitation services to atrisk families. The parent education and support services are effective in preventing child abuse/neglect.

\$150 provides a visit from a family support worker to an at-risk family. \$5.77 / 26 pay periods



Stop Child Abuse and Neglect (SCAN) | Provides child abuse prevention and safety information to school children. Topics include unsafe/inappropriate touching and social media/internet safety (including bullying).

\$25 provides 3 SCAN sessions for a child with their classmates in an elementary school setting.

\$.96 / 26 pay periods

NEW HOPE CHILDREN'S CLINIC



Wellness Checks | Provides well-check visits, in a school-based pedicatrician's office (newborn through 18-years old).

\$50 provides a well-child visit for a child.

\$1.92 / 26 pay periods

NORTH AL COALITION FOR THE HOMELESS



RISE (Restore, Invest, Support, Empower) | Provides a path to increased financial stability and sustainable housing through case management of clients who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless.

\$50 provides a homeless individual with a birth certificate and a state issued ID. \$1.92/26 pay periods

PARTNERSHIP FOR A DRUG-FREE COMMUNITY



Provides youth drug, alcohol and tobacco prevention and education, along with adult recovery resources in Madison County.

\$125 provides one person suffering from substance use disorder free support, a professional assessment, & associated treatment referrals.
\$4.81 / 26 pay periods

PHOENIX



Improves the quality of life, self-sufficiency, and employability primarily for individuals with disabilities. Services include vocational evaluations, job placement/coaching, and educational services in high schools.

\$270 per month helps a person with a disability prepare for, obtain & keep employment.

THE SALVATION ARMY OF MADISON CO.



Extended Stay | Helps individuals move from homeless to self-reliant members of our community by providing the tools and training needed to achieve independence.

\$650 a week provides meals, housing, counseling, & resources for one person. \$25 / 26 pay periods

STILL SERVING VETERANS



Veteran Resource Connection Program Connects Veterans and their families in crisis with community resources such as housing, shelter, food, transportation, and utility assistance.

\$46 creates a connecting support system for veterans, helping to find employment or address unmet needs in a crisis.

\$1.77 / 26 pay periods

UNITED CEREBRAL PALSY OF HSV & TN VALLEY



Provides individuals with developmental, acquired or aging disabilities and their families, education, therapy, technology and social services, enhancing their independence, quality of life and community inclusion.

\$50 provides therapy to help a child walk, talk, eat, play, laugh, learn, & live life without limitations. \$1.92 / 26 pay periods

VILLAGE OF PROMISE



Promise Preparatory Early Childhood Development Program | Provides high-quality, affordable, full-day early childhood education for infant through 4-yr olds, 5 days a week.

\$219 provides a scholarship for an under-resourced child for a week. \$8.42 / 26 pay periods
