Medical Opportunities:

THE UNIVERSITY OF ALABAMA AT BIRMINGHAM SCHOOL OF MEDICINE EARLY ASSURANCE PROGRAM WITH ALABAMA A&M UNIVERSITY

- Program provides early acceptance to the UAB School of Medicine for students who meet the requirements for matriculation.

MEHARRY MEDICAL SCHOOL (SIX-WEEK SUMMER PROGRAM)

ROSS UNIVERSITY SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

- A pathway program in abbreviation for the purpose of completing the MD degree at RUSM. RUSVM will designate four seats for eligible students during the admissions process.

AMERICAN UNIVERSITY OF ANTIGUA COLLEGE OF MEDICINE (AUA)

- Established a program under which students and graduates of AAMU are guaranteed admission into AUA's MD educational program and scholarship opportunities under the terms and conditions set forth.

Pharmaceutical Opportunities:

HOWARD UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF PHARMACY

- Under the dual degree program, students will be able to earn both the baccalaureate degree, in an appropriate science discipline from Alabama A&M University and the Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) degree from Howard University in a total of seven years instead of the eight years that is traditionally required.

Nursing Opportunities:

UNIVERSITY OF NORTH ALABAMA SCHOOL OF NURSING

- This agreement establishes a pathway for our students to obtain a degree in the nursing /health care profession in 16 months.

Apply now to the Guaranteed Admissions Interview Program

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

The Guaranteed Admissions Interview Program shall be for students at Alabama A&M University who:

- a) Receive a positive endorsement from the AAMU pre-medical committee/advisor.
- b) Meet all technical requirements for entry as designated in the VCOM College Catalog.
- c) Meet all general admission requirements as described in Exhibit A.
- d) Complete all required courses as described in Exhibit B before graduation from AAMU.
- e) Complete the majority of required coursework at AAMU. If the candidate is a transfer student, he/she must have completed at least 30 credit hours at AAMU and be approved by VCOM to participate in this agreement.
- f) Have completed 90 credit hours by time of application.
- g) Present a science and overall GPA of 3.50 or greater at the time of application.

h) Obtain a competitive score on the medical college admissions test (MCAT).

i) Obtain a minimum of forty (40) hours of health care and forty (40) community volunteer hours at time of application.

j) Obtain a minimum of eighty (80) hours of health care and eighty (80) community volunteer hours by the time of matriculation.

k) Was not the recipient of any significant conduct violations(s) by AAMU. Additionally, candidate must report, in advance, any criminal charge or arrest and any misdemeanor, felony, summary charge or any other criminal charge (whether or not the candidate was convicted). VCOM will determine if any disqualify the candidate from participation in this agreement.

l) Are U.S. Citizens or permanent residents of the United States. Comply with all other requirements set forth in this Agreement.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Howard University, through the College of Pharmacy, herein referred to as the College of Pharmacy, agrees to:

1. Permit qualified Alabama A&M University students, who have successfully completed a prescribed three-year course of study and have satisfied the College of Pharmacy admission criteria, to enroll in their fourth year, as first professional year students in the Pharm.D. program.
2. Give priority in admission to dual degree program applicants from Alabama A&M University when those applicants have completed the first three years of the dual program, have satisfied admission requirements of the Pharm.D. program, and their credentials competitive with other applicants competing for admission to the Pharm.D. program.

NOTE: Minimum GPA for admission to the dual degree program is 2.5.

3. Permit students who have entered the College of Pharmacy under this dual degree program and who have successfully completed their first year in the Pharm.D. program to receive the Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts degree from Alabama A&M University and continue their studies in the College of Pharmacy for completion of the final three years of their professional education for award of the Pharm.D. degree.

- A Bachelor of Science in Biology degree will be awarded upon completion of the following:
 - COP Pre-Requisite Requirements - (AAMU)
 - AAMU Core Course Requirements - (AAMU)

- COP First Professional Year (selected courses)
- A Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) degree will be awarded upon completion of the following:

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

XULA-ALABAMA AGRICULTURAL AND MECHANICAL UNIVERSITY: Dual Degree Program Admission Criteria. A student interested in the XULA-AAMU Dual Degree Program must be enrolled at Alabama A&M University in order to participate in the program. Additional requirements are listed below:

ALABAMA A&M UNIVERSITY

- Admitted and enrolled at Alabama A&M University
- Submit a Letter of Interest to the Dual Degree Program in student's first or second year enrolled at Alabama A&M University.
- Complete Zoom or Telephone Interview with COP Office of Student Affairs once Letter of Interest is submitted for the dual degree program.
- 2.75 Preferred Prerequisite GPA and 2.75 preferred Math/ Science GPA
- Be in good standing (both academic and conduct)

XAVIER UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF PHARMACY

- Completion of COP Pre-Requisite Discipline
- Requirements offered at Alabama A&M University
- Submission of admissions application via PharmCAS (Centralized Application System)
- Onsite Interview at the COP (required by accrediting agency) after PharmCAS application is submitted and admission requirements are satisfied
- 2.75 Preferred Prerequisite GPA and 2.75 preferred Math/ Science.

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Want to Become a Physician Assistant?

Apply now to the Physician Assistant Program

The PA Program is offering the PAALS Program to specific colleges to provide the opportunity for candidates from rural areas, low socioeconomic statuses (SES) backgrounds, and underrepresented minorities to enter health careers that will lead to successful entry into medicine as a physician assistant.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

The PAALS Program encourages candidates from rural areas, low socioeconomic states (SES) backgrounds, and underrepresented minorities to enter health careers. Studies have shown that students from rural or medically underserved areas are more likely to provide medical care to disadvantaged populations. The PAALS Program shall be for Alabama A&M University students, each academic year, who:

- a) Meet all general admission requirements as described in Exhibit A.
- b) Complete all required courses as described in Exhibit B before graduation from the University.
- c) Present a science and overall GPA of 3.0 or greater.
- d) Earn a competitive score on the Graduate Record Exam (GRE).
- e) Be United States citizens or permanent residents of the United States.
- f) Comply with all requirements set forth in this agreement.

EXHIBIT A

- 1) Submit an application to the PA Program through the Centralized Application Service for Physician Assistants (CASPA).
- 2) Earn a Baccalaureate degree from a regionally-accredited college/university prior to matriculation into the PA Program.
- 3) Provide Graduate Record Examination (GRE) General Test scores from the Verbal, Quantitative and Analytic sections. Applicants with advanced

degrees whose GRE scores are older than 5 years (i.e., the time limit that ETS will send scores) can request the PA Program to consider dated scores if the applicant can provide documentation of their GRE scores directly from the institution they attended. The documentation should be sent directly to the student's graduate degree institution to the PA Admissions office prior to the designated deadline for application evaluation. Please note that recent GRE scores often make applicants with an advanced degree more competitive than applicants with an advanced degree that do not have recent GRE scores. Furthermore, as with all applicants, the UAB admissions review committee could still determine that the applicant should retake the GRE and reapply the next application cycle.

- 4) Have a minimum cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 (A=4.0).
- 5) Have a minimum GPA of 3.0 in natural science courses
- 6) Have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 in the program prerequisite courses, with a minimum grade of C in each.
- 7) Have the technical ability to complete the program (see Essential Requirements and Technical Standards)
- 8) Interview with PA Program faculty.
- 9) Obtain Medical clearance - UAB physician assistant students must be medically cleared for enrollment. Detailed information is available via UAB Student Health Services.
- 10) Undergo a criminal background check and consent to drug testing.
