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#### Interview Questions for Communications Media Majors

- What aspect of communications media are you most passionate about (e.g., film, journalism, public relations, social media, advertising) and why?

#### Interview Questions for Special Education Majors

## Foundational Knowledge & Philosophy

- What does a "Least Restrictive Environment" (LRE) mean to you, and how do you ensure it's
  implemented effectively for all your students? (This tests your understanding of a core principle of
  IDEA.)
- Describe the different types of learning disabilities you are familiar with. How would your
  instructional approach differ for a student with dyslexia versus a student with dyscalculia?
   (Demonstrates your knowledge of specific disabilities and your ability to differentiate instruction.)
- Explain the IEP process from start to finish. What is your role as a teacher at each stage? (Tests your procedural knowledge and your understanding of your responsibilities.)
- How do you incorporate a student's strengths and interests into their IEP goals and daily instruction? (Shows your commitment to a strengths-based approach rather than a deficit-based one.)
- What is the importance of data collection in special education? Give an example of a time you used data to make an instructional decision. (Highlights your ability to use evidence-based practices and monitor progress.)

#### Classroom Management & Instruction

- Tell me about a time you had to de-escalate a challenging behavior in the classroom. What steps did you take, and what was the outcome? (A behavioral-based question that assesses your crisis management skills and your ability to remain calm.)
- Describe your approach to creating an inclusive classroom environment where all students feel valued and supported. (Focuses on your pedagogical philosophy and your commitment to equity.)
- How do you collaborate with general education teachers to support students with IEPs in their classes? (Assesses your ability to be a team player and your understanding of co-teaching and inclusion models.)
- Walk me through a lesson plan you would create for a small group of students with diverse learning needs. (Tests your practical application of differentiated instruction and your organizational skills.)
- How do you use assistive technology to support student learning? Provide an example of a tool you would use and for what purpose. (Shows your familiarity with modern educational tools and your ability to match technology to student needs.)



#### Communication & Collaboration

- How do you build strong, trusting relationships with the parents of your students? How would you
  handle a difficult conversation with a parent who disagrees with an IEP recommendation? (Tests
  your communication skills and your ability to handle conflict professionally.)
- Describe how you would collaborate with a team of professionals, such as a school psychologist, occupational therapist, or speech-language pathologist. (Assesses your understanding of the multidisciplinary team approach and your role within it.)
- How do you maintain confidentiality and privacy regarding student information? (Crucial question to ensure you understand ethical and legal responsibilities.)
- Tell me about a time you had to advocate for a student's needs. What was the situation, and what did you do? (Highlights your passion and commitment to your students' well-being.)
- How do you stay current with new research, best practices, and legal changes in the field of special education? (Demonstrates your dedication to professional growth.)

#### Personal & Reflective Questions

- Why did you choose to become a special education teacher? What motivates you to work with this specific population of students? (A personal question that reveals your passion and commitment to the field.)
- What do you consider your greatest strength as a special education teacher? What about your greatest area for growth? (Shows your self-awareness and your ability to reflect on your practice.)
- Tell me about a time you failed or made a mistake in the classroom. What did you learn from it? (Demonstrates humility, resilience, and a growth mindset.)
- How do you manage stress and prevent burnout in such a demanding role? (An important question that shows you have strategies for self-care.)
- Is there anything else you would like us to know about you that we haven't covered? (A final opportunity to make a lasting impression and highlight a key skill or experience.)



## Interview Questions for Visual Art Majors

## General & Portfolio-Focused Questions

- Tell us about yourself and why you chose to pursue a career in art/graphic design.
- Walk us through your portfolio. Which project are you most proud of and why? What was your role in its creation, and what challenges did you overcome? (Be ready to discuss your process, problem-solving, and the impact of your work.)
- What software and tools are you most proficient in
- How do you stay updated with the latest design trends, technologies, and industry developments?
- What do you consider to be the most important elements or principles of good design?

## Process & Problem-Solving Questions

- Describe your typical design process from concept to completion.
- How do you approach a new project when given a brief, or if the client/stakeholder has limited context?
- How do you handle constructive criticism or negative feedback on your work?
- Tell us about a time you faced a significant creative block. How did you overcome it?
- How do you prioritize and manage multiple projects with tight deadlines?

## Collaboration & Industry Insight Questions

- How do you work with collaborators, such as copywriters, developers, or marketing teams?
- What, in your opinion, makes a design successful or memorable?
- How do you ensure brand consistency across different platforms and media?
- What are the key differences between designing for print media versus digital media, and are you comfortable with both?
- Where do you see the field of art/graphic design heading in the next 5-10 years, and how do you plan to adapt?
