## Student Learning Outcomes

Student learning outcomes	<ol> <li>(3) Outcome statements.</li> <li>Stating what "students" know, think or are able to do as a result of the instruction.</li> <li>Be stated in the future tense in terms of what students should be able to do as a result of instruction.</li> </ol>
Assessment measures	<ol> <li>(2) Measures per student learning outcome.</li> <li>(2) Direct measures or (1) direct and (1) indirect measures per student learning outcome.</li> <li>Be directly related to the outcome.</li> </ol>
	1. Tool used to assess the measure.
Performance targets	<ol> <li>Use component (not student or respondent) as unit of analysis.</li> <li>Relate to outcome and assessment measure.</li> <li>Be specific ("x% of responses will be correct for each question" or "y% of scores for each item on rubric or survey will be at least 4"). (SLO)</li> <li>Avoid vague words such as "most" or "majority".</li> <li>Avoid "all" or "100%" targets.</li> </ol>

**Student Learning Outcome:** *Students will create an effective resume.* 

Assessment Measure: Number of resumes.

**Evaluation Tool:** *Rubric.* 

**Performance Target:** At least 90% of the submitted resumes will be created effectively.
